
A guide to doing business in Oil City, Pennsylvania



We are a designated Keystone Main Street, nationally accredited by Main Street America. NEW BUSINESS CHECKLIST

When you've firmed up your business plan, you'll need to visit both City Hall and the Main Street Office several times while preparing to open:

1.) Obtain Zoning Approval

City Hall: Zoning Office (814) 678-3016 Ensure that your business concept is permitted in your desired building/space; Fees may apply if zoning variance is needed.

2.) Explore Downtown Opportunities

Oil City Main Street Program (814) 677-3152 Learn about available sites, funding opportunities and other downtown resources.

3.) Obtain a Building Permit

City Hall: Code Office (814) 678-3003 State Law; Fee based on cost of project.

4.) Pass a Commercial Fire Inspection

Oil City Fire Department (814) 678-3061 Ensure that the building/space is safe to operate in; determine Occupant Load (maximum occupancy).

5.) Obtain a Business License

City Hall: Code Office (814) 678-3003

Requirement for anyone doing business within the City of Oil
City; Fee: New: \$25, Annual \$25-\$100 based on sales volume.

6.) Obtain a Sign Permit

City Hall: Zoning Office (814) 678-3016 *City Ordinance; Fee:* \$5.

7.) Obtain Alarm Permit

City Hall: Police Department (814) 678-3080 Ensure emergency response; Fee: \$30/year.

8.) Complete Emergency Call Form

Police Department (814) 678-3080 Provide police/fire with contact info in case of emergency; No fee.

9.) Obtain Parking Permits (optional)

City Hall: Police Department (814) 678-3080

Free up on-street parking for downtown patrons; Fee: \$5

application fee, \$30/quarter. Meter bags \$5 deposit for move-in.

10.) Contact the Utility Office

City Hall: Utility Office (814) 678-3002 Sign up for water/sewage & trash service, schedule final read of previous account holder; Fee: \$20 one-time account setup fee, applied to first bill.

11.) Complete Business Profile Form

Oil City Main Street Program (814) 677-3152 Provide contact info for downtown business directory and discuss opening plans/needs, operating schedule, & downtown opportunities.

FUNDING, FINANCING & TAX INCENTIVES

Façade Improvement Grant Program

- 50/50, reimbursable matching grant for exterior storefront improvements on eligible buildings located within the designated Oil City Main Street District.
- Maximum grant: \$5,000, subject to individual project limits.
- Eligible projects include: awnings, signs, cleaning, painting, architectural restoration, lighting, and professional design assistance.
- Grants are subject to availability of funding. All projects require approval by the OCMS Design Committee and Oil City Council.

Oil City LERTA

Local Economic Revitalization Tax Assistance

- Tax exemption for pre-approved alteration or new construction on eligible deteriorated or underutilized industrial, commercial or other business property.
- Tax forgiveness on the assessed value of improvements for up to 10 years (100% year 1, sliding to 0% in year 10).
- Must be filed with the City of Oil City at the time a building or alteration permit is secured.

Federal & State Rehabilitation Investment Tax Credits (RITC)

- 20% Tax Credit for rehabilitation of income-producing historic buildings
- Must be "substantial rehabilitation" (amount of rehab is greater than adjusted basis of the building or \$5,000; completed within 24-month period
- Must remain under same owner & income-producing for 5 years
- 10% credit may be available for non-historic buildings

Oil City Qualified Federal Opportunity Zones

- A federal tax incentive that encourages long-term investment of unrealized capital gains into certain low-income census tracts that have been designated by Governors as Qualified Opportunity Zones.
- There are two zones in Oil City, including all of the North and South Side Business Districts and some surrounding residential areas.
